

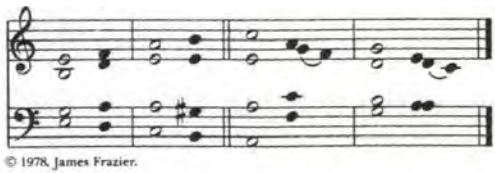

THE WORD OF GOD

First Lesson

Isaiah 2:1-5

**T**HE WORD THAT ISAIAH SON OF AMOZ SAW CONCERNING JUDAH AND JERUSALEM. In days to come the mountain of the Lord’s house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, “Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.” For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. Second Lesson

Romans 8:31-39

**W**HAT THEN ARE WE TO SAY ABOUT THESE THINGS? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God’s elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, “For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.” No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Holy Gospel John 15:9-17

¶The Gospeller introduces the Gospel and the people respond with “Glory to you, Lord Christ.”

**J**ESUS SAID TO HIS DISCIPLES: “as the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.”

Act of Remembrance

Celebrant: Let us confess to God the sins and shortcomings of the world; its pride, its selfishness, its greed; its evil divisions and hatreds. Let us confess our share in what is wrong, and our failure to seek and establish that peace which God wills for his children.



InAsMuch Offering for November—Hot Meals at St. Mark’s

Coordinated by the Social Justice Committee, St. Mark’s sponsors a monthly InAsMuch Offering named after Jesus’ appeal in the Gospel of Matthew to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick, and visit those in prison: *“In as much as you have done it into one of the least of these . . . you have done it unto me”*. Last month St. Mark’s raised funds for The Fire Relief Appeal of the Episcopal Diocese of Northern California. We’ll support the local PAWS Fund in December, when we will also post our calendar for 2022. This month we dedicate our offering to **St. Mark’s Hot Meals** neighborhood food ministry. St. Mark’s has been hosting monthly Hot Meals for some 30 years. We provide a fresh, healthy, hot dinner plus a bag lunch, and due to Covid, dinners are packed To Go. Typically we serve around 80 lunch bags, with sandwiches, boiled eggs, cookies and a juice box. Our 100 to-go dinners include a hot dish with meat and vegetarian options, as well as bottled water, garlic bread, eggs, salad and dessert. People are being very good about mask-wearing and social distancing, and other COVID-19 precautions. We are helped by many volunteers from student and youth groups, plus other churches in the area, plus food donations. Our next Hot Meals will be on 11/20 and 12/18. Support this ongoing mission! We work in 2 shifts of about 2 hours each, and there are usually around 15 people per shift, so it’s not too arduous, even in these restricted days.
